

This is an example of an email that is meant to trick you into clicking on the link. Once you do, a virus can be uploaded to your computer so the files and logins can be retrieved by the scammers/ hackers.

- **NEVER CLICK ON THE LINKS...** If you need to check your account, exit the email and go to the website for the company and login as you usually would. Chances are you will be able to again access without a problem. Therefore showing you this email was a SCAM.
- In this case the recipient of the email, does not even have a Wells Fargo account. Be sure that you are not reacting to quickly. **STOP and REVIEW** the email closely.

They make it sound urgent so you will react quickly before you have time to research and find out it is a SCAM..
